

Preservation League Presents Members-Only Tour of Two *Seven to Save* sites on Sunday, June 28



On **Sunday, June 28th from 1:00 - 3:30 p.m.**, the Preservation League will offer a free behind-the-scenes tour of two *Seven to Save* sites in Columbia County.

Neither site is open to the public, and each is in different stages of stabilization and restoration. Tours will be led by guides who have extensive knowledge about these homes.

The [Van Hoesen House](#) was built in the early 1700s and retains a remarkable level of architectural detail. The [Plumb-Bronson House](#) was built in 1811 and reoriented in 1849 to offer a grand view of the Hudson River.

This tour is limited to 50 registrants, and is open only to members of the Preservation League. Not a member?
